THE PENCIL: A HISTORY OF DESIGN AND CIRCUMSTANCE

The Marshall Public Library non-fiction book group will meet Wednesday, July 19th at 7:00 pm to discuss our current selection, *The Pencil* by Henry Petroski. Petroski is a civil engineer with a specialization in failure analysis. He is a professor of history and industrial design at Duke University with nineteen published books to his credit, *The Pencil* being one of the best known and most successful.

Pencils are an example of a pervasive object that is so taken for granted that they are almost invisible. Who would imagine that such a common and apparently simple tool could have such fascinating stories behind its origins and evolution? Yet it does, and Petroski's book does such a fine job of explanation that it has come to be considered a classic of the genre.
