Hobbyists and crafters now have a new resource for their passions at the Marshall Public Library. After a successful trial run, the library has signed on to EBSCO's Hobbies & Crafts Reference Center. The services provides library patrons access to nearly 2,000 magazines and books as well as over 700 videos related to their pursuits. There is something for everyone. EQUIFAX DATA BREACH MEETING

More than 140 million Americans were impacted by the Equifax data breach. Now, the Marshall Public Library and Pocatello Police Department are teaming up to help you protect yourself in the aftermath.

Thursday, November 9 from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. at the Marshall Public Library, Dianne Brush, Community Services Specialist with the Pocatello Police Department, will present "What the Equifax Data Breach Means to You." During the program, Brush will outline what a data breach is, how they happen, how the hack could affect you, and what steps we can all take to protect our credit.

NONFICTION BOOK GROUP

The Nonfiction Book Group will meet on Wednesday, November 15th at 7:00 pm for discussion of the latest title we'll be reading, *The Emerald Mile*. This award-winning account of the effort of three river guides to set a speed record for a transit by boat through the Grand Canyon reads like a thriller. On the heels of the largest El Niño event on record, Kenton Grua and two compatriots set off on a journey of 277 miles through some of the most intense white water in North America. Meanwhile, 15 miles upriver of their starting point, operators of the Glen Canyon Dam were desperately struggling to prevent a catastrophic failure.
