## SUMMER READING STATISTICS

We had a great turnout for all of our summer reading programs this year, from adults to teens to children. A total of 847 people participated in our program this year. Between all three programs, we had 226 library events over the summer. Our book wagon went out on 21 different days and visited 12 different places.

In total, we gave away 5951 books to children.

We also celebrated with the adults who finished the summer reading program by throwing them a brunch, at which prizes were given away. We had 30 adults finish our final summer reading goal, and prizes included chips, soda, gift cards, t-shirts, and solar eclipse glasses.
