KIDS

Children can sign up for the summer reading program, either at the preschool level or the elementary level, and get a list of reading-centered activities. Once they complete ten activities, they can receive a free book! Another ten will get them another book. Register and pick up prizes at the library. We will also have activities every weekday at 2:00 pm. The schedule is as follows:
