The class is designed for 11-14 year-olds and helps introduce them to the basics of babysitting. 

## KILLERS OF THE FLOWER MOON

Our nonfiction book group is reading *Killers of the Flower Moon* by David Grann this month. This book was published in April 2017, and appeared on many critics' lists for the best books of the year. *Killers of the Flower Moon* tells the story of a series of murders and other crimes targeting members of the Osage Indian tribe. The FBI, then in its infancy, investigated the crimes. The case sealed their reputation as an effective crime-fighting organization. The book group will meet to discuss it on May 16th at 7:00 pm in the upstairs meeting room.
