BOOK QUEST UPDATE!

PRONUNCIATOR

Have you set your New Year's Resolutions yet? If you're like us, you might have set a goal to learn a new language this year. Luckily for you, the Marshall Public Library has tons of great language-learning resources available to our patrons.

You might already be aware of our collection of language-learning books and CDs on the 2nd floor, in the 500s. But you might not be aware of our online language-learning center: Pronunciator! Pronunciator is an online software tool that we provide to our patrons. If you create an account with your library card, you can learn a new language, starting at any level from beginner to expert. Pronunciator is completely free to you, and includes both textual and audio resources. It'll even track your progress!
