The on-demand film streaming service Kanopy is now available for a free trial at Marshall Public Library from May 1-17. City residents with library cards can access Kanopy and sign up to start streaming films instantly by visiting marshallpl.kanopy.com. Kanopy showcases more than 30,000 of the world's best films including documentaries, rare and hard to find titles, film festival and indie favorites, and international and classic films as well as educational materials.

Films can be streamed for this trial from any computer. Please note, the trial will only be accessible through a web browser; access will not be available through the Kanopy app.

TORI AMOS DISPLAY

Beginning Friday, May 3, library page Rebecca Ayre will share her Tori Amos memorabilia collection. Amos is not only an accomplished musician; she's a founding member of the Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network (RAINN), America's largest nonprofit anti-sexual assault organization.

This collection includes rare CDs and vinyl albums, autographs, photos, and fan tributes. Items related to Amos' music and activism will also be available to patrons for checkout.

"Tori Amos has inspired me through her music and activism for 20 years," says Ayre. "She is a classically trained pianist and a talented lyricist. Her music speaks to my heart. Her work with RAINN has inspired me and many others throughout the years to speak about sexual assault and violence and to raise money and create awareness for the cause. I'm excited to share my love for Tori and the RAINN hotline and organization with our community."
