Beginning Friday, July 5, Marshall Public Library will feature the artistry of Portneuf Valley Woodturners Association (PVWA). Woodturners hone symmetrical wood objects using lathes and hand-held tools around an axis of rotation. The ancient craft of woodturnery produces items including knobs, spindles, balusters, musical instruments, and a variety of vessels.

PVWA is a fun loving, diverse, and enthusiastic group; they hail from all over Eastern and Central Idaho and have a range of experience and abilities. PVWA believes strongly in safety, cooperative learning, and evolving through mentorship, demonstrations, and shared experiences. Members enjoy friendly feedback and recommendations from fellow club members.
