

Love is stronger than death.


Each year, more than 350 Idaho residents die by their own hand. Beginning September 6, MPL will honor those lost to suicide — and those who grieve them — with a second floor display hosted by COMMUNITY SUICIDE PREVENTION (formerly SPAN Eastern Idaho).

Community Suicide Prevention is a volunteer organization devoted to help and healing throughout southeastern Idaho. CPS offers risk assessment, prevention, and post-crisis training. It also hosts support groups, memorial walks, and other events for survivors.

The CSP display will include space for visitors affected by suicide to post remembrances of loved ones, disclose their own struggles, or show anonymous support.
