## From the Stacks

### **FRANKENSTEIN**, or, *The Modern Prometheus*

Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley  
(PB SHELLEY)

We all know about Frankenstein, right? He's tall, maybe green, has neck bolts, and groans incoherently, scaring the daylights out of everyone. Boris Karloff's 1931 movie monster was all that and more.

Author Mary Shelley wouldn't recognize what has become of her characters. Dr. Victor Frankenstein creates "the creature," who in the book is never named. The book is divided into three sections, the second of which tells how Dr. Frankenstein's creation destroys everything he holds dear. The creature is well-spoken, intelligent, possessed of personality and emotion, and moves swiftly and gracefully towards his tragic end.

*Frankenstein* is a fascinating exploration of what it means to be human, and what limits exist (or should exist?) between humanity and godhood. Wollstonecraft Shelley wrote *Frankenstein* during the collision of rapid scientific advancement and Europe's Age of Enlightenment; the result provides a narrative that has fascinated for two centuries and still thrills today.
